

Enrollment Report Summary

March 22, 2012

KCTCS COMPARISON

- For spring 2012, Gateway is one of three (3) KCTCS colleges to remain flat or increase in enrollment
- For fall 2011, Gateway was one of nine (9) KCTCS colleges to remain flat or increase in enrollment
- From fall 2011 to spring 2012, Gateway enrollment decline by 1.30%, compared to a KCTCS decline of 16.96%
- For the past two years (2010-2011 and 2011-2012) Gateway enrollment has held and increased at a level surpassing the other two KCTCS urban institutions: Bluegrass and Jefferson

ACADEMIC PROGRAMMING

- All program clusters experienced a decline in enrollment in spring 2012, with the exception of the Transfer cluster, with a 19.4% increase in enrollment
- The program cluster with the largest percentage decline in spring 2012 was Education, with an 11.1% decline in enrollment

DEVELOPMENTAL EDUCATION

- In fall 2011 duplicated enrollment in developmental education courses reached 2,038; in fall 2007 enrollment was 706
- Developmental education success rates have dramatically increased over the baseline year
 - Success rate for English has moved from 63.3% to 77.2%
 - Success rate for Math has moved from 59% to 64.8%
 - Success rate for Reading has moved from 55.1% to 78.3%

IMPACTS ON ENROLLMENT

Federal SAP Process for Financial Aid

- Spring 2012:
 - *320 students affected by process, of those:*
 - 266 were reviewed by the committee
 - 172 were approved
 - 94 were denied

Ability to Benefit Potential Impact for Fall 2012

- 97 students fell into category in spring 2012
- 85 students fell into category in fall 2011
